Dear Parents/Carers,

Last week we wrote to you noting that our schools would remain open until the 18th of December, however, as you will be aware, numbers of Coronavirus cases are increasing rapidly across Wales, including in Carmarthenshire. As noted previously we have been monitoring the issue on a daily basis.

The rising number of cases in the community is having a significant effect on staff and pupils having to self-isolate, leading to major staffing issues within schools as well as putting considerable pressure on the Test Trace Protect teams. We are concerned that this situation will worsen in the coming weeks.

Yesterday the Welsh Government made the decision that all secondary schools across Wales would move to remote learning from Monday the 14th of December.

Due to the number of cases in other sectors and after considering all the evidence available we have decided that all schools in Carmarthenshire will have the **option to move to distance learning** as from Tuesday 15th December until the end of term on Friday 18th December. This could mean that pupils will not be on school premises during that period and distance learning activities would be provided for them by their teachers.

We all want to enjoy time with family members over Christmas, and providing distance learning from the 15th December onwards will give a period of 10 clear days before Christmas Day, in the possible event of learners or family members needing to self-isolate. This is in line with Welsh Government's Technical Advice Cell statement issued on December 2nd.

Your school has decided that they will move to remote learning for the last few days of this term therefore-

- If your child is eligible for Free School Meals, you will receive a payment to assist you during the time they will be at home. We will process this as soon as we can.
- All primary schools will only provide childcare for frontline health and social care workers if those families have no other options.
- Our schools will also ensure that there is support in place for our most vulnerable learners.

It is vitally important that pupils remain at home next week carrying out the work set by their teachers. This will make sure pupils keep up with their work and also to prevent any further transmission of the virus in the community.
